The team did a mini-action on behalf of Shaker Aamer in January. This is the next action which is based on Christian Aid's campaign Let's Make Tax Fair. Can you please put it on the church website running through until mid May, church notices 12th 19th 26th April and 3rd May and in the May magazine please.

Let's Make Tax Fair

We all pay our taxes. But some multi national companies can get away with not paying their fair share.

Developing countries lose an estimated \$160 billion a year from corporate tax dodging. We can put a stop to this.

We need the next government to introduce a Tax Dodging Bill to tackle corporate tax dodging, and to make tax fair for everyone. The potential benefits are huge.

The Tax Dodging Bill could generate billions for developing countries. These reforms will also create a level playing field which will benefit responsible companies that already pay their taxes.

Support the Christian Aid campaign calling for a law that will:

Make it harder for big companies to dodge UK taxes and ensure they're not getting unfair tax breaks

- Ensure UK tax rules don't encourage big companies to avoid tax in developing countries
- Make the UK tax regime more transparent and tougher on tax dodging.

You can tell your local candidates about the importance of supporting a Tax Dodging Bill - email them now by going to the Christian Aid website http://www.christianaid.org.uk/, where you can also add your name to the tax-dodging bill petition.

Still Walking for Syria

Two years ago, I completed the West Highland Way, 96 miles solo with a tent, in solidarity with the people of Syria.

Now, the situation in Syria is far worse, with much of the country now in ruins. So in May, I'm setting off again with my rucksack, this time, I'm raising money for Tearfund, who are working with Christian partners inside Syria and in neighbouring countries with displaced people, providing relief, housing, education, medical facilities, and trauma support. I'm starting from Fort William and following the East Highland Way to Aviemore, then (time and legs permitting) the River Spey from its source to its estuary on the Moray Firth, making this a true coast-to-coast walk of around 150 miles.
