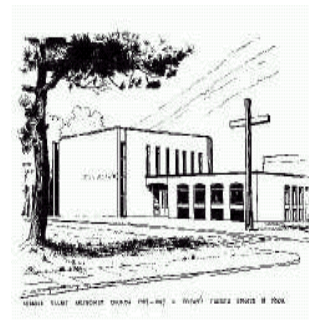

WE REALLY NEED SOME HELP!

We have now set up one mobile contact number for people to call if they need help out of office hours when using our building, such as not being able to lock the door or finding a broken window. We have a rota of people taking responsibility for a week at a time, the more volunteers we have the fewer weeks you will be responsible for. WE NEED AT LEAST ONE MORE PERSON on the rota. The system has been set up so we are not giving out personal phone numbers. The phone has been described as “What a lovely quiet little phone!” which shows the level of call outs we have received – none since we started in October so it isn't a huge task to undertake. Counting the collection - Help needed

You are probably aware that a team of dedicated people help to count the collection after the morning service each Sunday. A couple of people are leaving the team so we need to find some new recruits to replace them and, if more than two come forward, increase the size of the team.

2 counters are involved each week along with that week's keyholder. Our current numbers mean that each counter is required once every 4 weeks. The task involves opening the offering envelopes and then counting and recording the contents before helping to count and bag the cash that is going to the bank. The whole process normally takes less than an hour.
