## Advent is coming!

#### **Decorating the Sanctuary Christmas Tree**

This year we will be decorating the Christmas tree in the sanctuary with 'Chrismons' (from the words 'Christ monograms'). Each Chrismon should be white (the liturgical colour for Christmas) but can be decorated with gold (the symbolic colour for the glory and majesty of God). Shapes of Chrismons can be obtained from the office or from the web (<a href="http://d2lyc38tx1fvww.cloudfront.net/chrismon-patterns.pdf">http://d2lyc38tx1fvww.cloudfront.net/chrismon-patterns.pdf</a>). It is suggested that Chrismons be made out of white card, coloured or painted gold or have gold items stuck to them, and have a thread or ribbon (white or gold) attached so that they can be hung on the Christmas tree. Chrismons can be hung on the Christmas tree from the first Sunday of Advent (27th November).
