### **Reasons to make a Will and have it properly prepared**

If you are not married but are living with someone, under the Intestacy Rules your partner is not entitled to anything from your estate. If you are married, although the Intestacy Rules do make provision for your spouse, you are likely to miss out on considerable Inheritance Tax savings if you rely on them and don't make a Will. If you want to make gifts on your death to anyone who isn't an immediate family member, the Intestacy Rules won't achieve that. The only way to achieve that is by making a Will. Likewise, if you want to make gifts to any organisations or charities on your death, the only way to do that is by making a Will.
