## Peace


Peace is a topic that is often talked about, both outside the church community and within it. We long for and pray for peace in different parts of the world where there is tension, warfare or violence. We hear of 'road-maps' to peace, of peace-keeping forces, of peace talks, of peace-makers and peace-breakers. We treasure moments when we can personally enjoy some peace. We share 'The Peace' in services of Holy Communion. Within the Bible the Hebrew and Greek words for peace (shalom and eirene) are frequently used. Peace there is about wholeness and well-being. It is the parting gift of Christ Jesus to his followers. It is a quality ('fruit') produced by the indwelling of the Holy Spirit.

This year marks the fortieth anniversary of the *Week of Prayer for World Peace*. It was a Christian initiative that led to the founding of this week in 1974, but it soon became an inter-faith activity, and now welcomes everyone, of all faith traditions or none, to take part. Its first Chairman, the late Dr. Edward Carpenter, former Dean of Westminster, established the guiding principle of the week in the words "The peace of the world must be prayed for by the faiths of the world", and this is still its basis today. In praying alongside those who do not share our faith, we are not saying that our differences are not important, but we are recognising that there are common goals which unite us with others, such that we can be partners together in praying and working for peace.

The road to peace is no easy path. As long as suspicion, fear, prejudice, ignorance, misunderstanding and the like persist there can be no true peace. Overcoming these things, especially when they are deep-seated and the result of long periods of conditioning, is never going to be quick or simple. Yet each of us needs to do what we can, with God's help, to live more peaceably with our neighbours, near and far.

I would also encourage you to pray for peace, especially during the *Week of Prayer for World Peace* which runs from 12<sup>th</sup>-19<sup>th</sup> October. You may wish to use the *Universal Prayer for Peace* which is reproduced below.

Lead me from death to life,  
from falsehood to truth.  
Lead me from despair to hope,  
from fear to trust.  
Lead me from hate to love,  
from war to peace.  
Let peace fill our heart,  
our world, our universe.



May the God of peace be with you.

## *Cover Verse*

The words on the front cover are taken from *The Street Bible and* are barely recognisable of the verse we know so well that says we must be 'born again'.(John3 v 3;Jesus said ..'.no one can see the kingdom of God unless he is born again') It is sometimes hard to see past the familiarity of bible verses. It may be useful to look at a new translation or paraphrase to see beyond the familiar words and help us to think about what a verse may mean.

We've been looking at John's gospel in our home group this term and in preparation for the session on John 3, I looked at JC Ryle's *Expository Thoughts on the Gospels* (recommended by my Dad!) . JC Ryle says the change needed in us 'is not merely reformation, or amendment, or moral change, or outward alteration of life. It is a thorough change of heart, will and character. It is a resurrection. It is a new creation....It is the implanting in our dead hearts of a new principle from above. It is the calling into existence of a new creature, with a new nature, new habits of life, new tastes, new desires, new appetites, new judgments, new opinions, new hopes and new fears. All this, and nothing less...'

JC Ryle asks if we know anything of this mighty change in our own lives. 'Have we been born again? Can any marks of the new birth be seen in us? Can the sound of the Spirit be heard in our daily conversation? Is the image ... of the Spirit to be discerned in our lives?'

They lived in Denton before moving to Cheadle Hulme and had a daughter Clair, and three grandchildren, Ella, Tom and Lauren. Colin thought the world of them all.

Colin's working life was with British Rail from January 1955 till March 1993, when he had to retire due to ill-health. He was in Signals & Telecommunications and worked himself up to being in Management and he travelled around a lot with his job. After retirement Colin kept really busy - he was a Trustee on the British Rail Superannuation Fund Management Committee. He belonged to the retired branch of the Transport Salaried Staff Association and was Secretary to the Fellowship of Retired Signal & Telecommunication Engineers. Colin was also, at one time, a co-opted School Governor at Woods Lane School and also a Patron of the Poynton Gilbert & Sullivan Society. With all these positions he put his heart and soul into all of them. Colin's interests included: climbing and walking in the Lake District, Peak District and Scotland, reading his monthly Space magazine, doing things on his computer, even from his hospital bed, watching Discovery programmes on television, especially those related to geography. and his garden.

Colin was never very well during his retirement but he attended Wednesday Worship here and occasionally managed to come on Sundays. He was a great believer in the power of prayer and had tremendous faith throughout his illness.

Colin will be remembered as someone who was very loyal and a good friend. He did not like big gatherings but he touched many people's lives with his caring and faith.

The last prayer meeting of Churches Together in Cheadle Hulme was held in our church in August. I would like to say a big "thank you" to all including Bob Richards who conducted the service, those who helped with hospitality and those who came to participate in a service which was an uplifting experience for us all.

The 'saga' of the reorganisation of Churches Together continues. Our next meeting will be in Grove Lane Baptist Church on Wednesday 8th October and will be a business meeting where the new constitution will be approved. There will be discussion and hopefully come to a consensus but if not each Representative will vote in the name of their church.

There will be other matters under discussion one of which will be the prayer meetings. What we have done for the past 20 years is no longer 'fit for purpose' in 2014. At present each church sends a list of items for praise and thanksgiving and two or three prayer requests and at the meeting we pray for these issues as we go away we remember these in prayer until the next meeting.

The issues which have arisen:-



## *Carbon Offset Fund*

In Feb 2009 it was agreed to set up a 'Carbon Offset Fund' to enable those who wish to 'offset' their carbon emissions incurred through travel to do so at church. The fund is used to support projects which are set out in CHMC's 10-year plan aimed at reducing the church's carbon footprint; this includes draught exclusion, roof insulation, cavity wall insulation, double glazing and light sensors.

Suggestions for contributing to the fund:-

Air travel outside Europe - £12 per person (one way)

Air travel within Europe - £7 per person (one way)

Car Travel - £3 per thousand miles (per car)

Envelopes are available near the pigeon holes, if you pay tax, you may wish to gift aid your contribution. Thank you, projects already completed are making a big difference to our carbon footprint.


